In the course of my career there, I taught *Emergence Christian Thought* (including a couple weeks devoted to Martin Luther) and *Biblical Theology*. I even taught a course on theological responses to the Holocaust.

A few years into teaching, I became the Pastor of First Congregational Church of Geneva, United Church of Christ. I



Vermont Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes (Draft)

March 19, 2023

Present: Aaron T, Carol J, Wade W, Deb K, Jamie H, Steve H, Karsten, Rebecca, Peter (guest)

Absent:

Called to order 10:45 Aaron T.

Pastor's Report: None

Secretary's Report: Clarification to minutes. Carol Johnson was appointed Secretary, but due to Call Committee duties, Karsten will step in to take minutes if need be. Approved (Steve H/Aaron T)

Treasurer's Report: (Steve) Contributions are up \$8,000 in February, up from 2022.Expenses are on track. Paying insurance bill quarterly.

Call Process Update: Carol reported the call committee completed the Ministry Site Profile and she asked the Council to review and approve via email next week. Liz will submit upon her return from vacation. The committee will start delving into the interview process next.


Pulpit Supply: Liz has secured pastors through the month of March. Pastor Rebecca Chancy will be the new Interim Pastor and will take on Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday services.

Lenten services: Ash Wednesday services will remain as in years past. For the remaining Wednesdays during Lent, we will focus on fellowship and offer a soup supper combined with short devotional.

The Alcohol policy was slightly modified to include timing of application and approval. It is now complete.

Capital Expenditure Update:

- Speakers. Work completed. Authorized \$1,000 for additional work at pulpit and stand. Final payment will be held back until speakers are tested and there is assurance everything is in good working order.
- Pastors Office: Painting is complete. Carpet is ordered.
- Vestry: To be addressed next painting, door, shifting shelves, carpet.
- Organ Recommendation is to replace the organ with a similar used unit. This organ has run its course and deferred maintenance will out-cost a replacement.
- Funds available for painting, carpet and pew repairs but the timing has to be determined.
- The purchase of 100 white event chairs for the Gathering Place is being considered.

Fundraising: No update.

New Business:

Forestry Grant – Aaron reported that there may be an opportunity through NRCS to obtain funding to create a Forestry Plan for the newly acquired land.

DNR Easement or purchase opportunity. Aaron reported that he and others are in discussion with the DNR about possible easement agreement of the 'wetlands' or outright purchase of the land around the creek near HWY 78.

Old Business:

Lutheran Brotherhood Grant application. Peter Antoine attended as a guest and the author of the Lutheran Brotherhood Grant Application. He shared if successful, the grant will provide funding and mentoring resources for a use and marketing plan for the Gathering Space and newly acquired land, prairie, and trails. The application is due on March 31, 2023.

Committees: Aaron recommended that the council address committee at a future meeting. Carol will distribute the 2019 Draft Committee Restructuring proposal. Karsten updated the group on the Endowment Committee: Laura W is the new Chair and Eric Haugen will replace Carol Parrell, who is resigning as of today.

A story from our La Crosse Area Synod

Wednesday may be a slump day for some, but at the La Crosse LuMin Lutheran Campus it's all about grace through *free cookie Wednesday*. Want a cookie? Take a cookie! They just give out cookies to make folks' day better — no strings attached.

As he's giving out the cookies, it's not unusual for Pastor Ben Morris to be asked, "Where do the cookies come from?" The answer is Lutheran grandmas up in the bluffs and hills made them with real butter and real love. Each week congregations throughout the La Crosse Area Synod drop off 500 cookies to be given away. Pastor Ben says, "It's like manna in the wilderness; there always seems to be enough," and these cookies taste better.



LuMin La Crosse is a place to gather in worship, connect to study, grab a cup of coffee, share a family style meal, sit in prayer, make bread for the women's shelter, take walks together and explore places afar in service to others. They advocate for others, share space with multicultural student groups, proudly display the pride flag and mostly reconnect with humanity and each other. Oh, and give out cookies!

Like all ELCA LuMin campus ministry sites across our synods, this ministry happens because congregations share food — yes, cookies — and also through Mission Support that is shared with our synods and churchwide organization to support these vital, transformative, grace-filled ministries with students. 

We plan to share more Mission Support details from 2022 with you in our March and April memos, so please keep an eye out for that.



It is our time to build a legacy

Become a member of the Legacy Fund. Members of the Legacy Fund come from all walks of life and are united by a desire to preserve our beautiful Church, Cemetery and adjoining land. Vermont Lutheran Church owns and maintains a cemetery, historic church building, Gathering Place and 115 acres of adjacent land with a hilltop viewscape. Christian stewardship involves the faithful management of all the gifts God has given us, including accumulated, inherited and appreciated resources. Therefore, we created the Legacy Fund to encourage, receive and administer these gifts.

Our goal is to generate and maintain a Legacy Fund of \$1 Million dollars, or more. Through receipt of bequests, grants and/or gifts, contributions to the Legacy Fund and investment growth will serve three very important purposes now and into the future:

- 1. Expand the cemetery and develop and maintain the adjacent land in a manner that maximizes its natural beauty and preserves its ecological importance; and,
- 2. Provide funds to pay property taxes on the portion of the adjacent land subject to taxes; and,
- 3. Provide funds for future maintenance of the cemetery and building and grounds needs of the Church.

Any legacy member whose contribution totals \$1,000 or more will be recognized with a brass plate on a prominently displayed plaque. Annual meeting reports will include all the names of those individuals who made a contribution of any amount that year.
